





## Siracusa II – Research Conference Series on Migration Research Workshop: Recommendations for the G7

25<sup>th</sup> April (afternoon) – 26<sup>th</sup> April 2017

Venue: Ortygia Business School, 124 Via Roma, Siracusa, Italy

Migration continues to be high on the agenda of global policy makers. Italy's G7 Presidency, along with Canada that will take over from Italy later this year, work has started on key issues of "Human Mobility," building on the UN Compact agreed in September 2016. The Italian G7 Sherpa has invited the Alliance of Lead Universities on Migration (ALUM) to provide a note ("non-paper") with research-informed specific policy recommendations for the G7 Sherpas' attention ahead of the G7 Taormina Summit on May 26-27 2017.

Following the successful first ALUM conference in Siracusa last year, the Siracusa II conference will be devoted to this endeavour and focus on the G7's areas of policy attention:

- 1. Investing in countries of origin and transit;
- 2. Protection of children (countries of transit), hosting and integration unaccompanied minors as well as other vulnerable groups;
- 3. Valuing the positive contribution of migrants (particularly in view of G 7 demographics), including net fiscal impact and possibly also political dimensions and perceptions.

In addition, the workshop will assess the role of business, international institutions and the record so far of the new regional and bilateral "package deals". Mr. Francesco Aureli of Italy's G7 Sherpa Unit will deliver a keynote speech. Following the workshop, the note will be finalized for submission to the Italian G7 Sherpa of migration.

A pre-event will also be held in the morning of April 25 (Tuesday) focusing on research from frontier refugee ghosting countries in the Middle East and North Africa: Lebanon, Turkey, Egypt, Kurdistan, with research presentations from these countries.

Through the conference we will show the top five winners of LSE IGA's recent video competition on migration, sponsored by the Open Society Foundation.
